Citizen Science Wetland & Fauna Survey

Join in a fun and educational day with waterway ecologists Geraldine and Steve Janicke carrying out a macro-invertebrate and associated biological survey of Lake Nunijup and associated wetlands and bushland, east of Kendenup, near Mt Barker. This Green Skills' Citizen Science survey event aims to provide clues to why these lakes and adjoining bushland are a haven for birds. The Frankland Primary School will also be involved during the afternoon.

Meet at the Lake Nunijup Hall by 9.30am. From Mt Barker, travel up Albany Highway 24.5 km, turn left into the Martagallup/Frankland Road. Travel 20km then turn right at sign, following road for 750m to Lake Nunijup and its Hall. Transport available from Denmark.

Free, all welcome. Bring wellies/shoes that can get wet, sun/insect protection, water/packed lunch, binoculars, camera.
