Join in a fun and educational day with waterway ecologists Geraldine and Steve Janicke carrying out wetland assessments of Murdellup Lagoon and associated wetlands and bushland, between Cranbrook and Frankland. This Green Skills' Citizen Science event aims to find out how well Murdellup Lagoon wetland is doing since fencing and eco restoration work began there in 2012. We will also visit other local wetlands including Lake Poorrarecup.

Meet at Warrenup Nature Reserve, corner of Stockyard Road and the Frankland-Cranbrook Road. From Mt Barker, travel up Albany Highway 24.5 km, turn left into the Martagallup- Stockyard Road. Travel 36 km (16 km beyond the Lake Nunijup Hall turnoff) by 9.30am. The tour will conclude by 3pm.. Transport available from Denmark.



Free- all welcome. Bring wellies/walking shoes, sun/insect protection, packed lunch, plenty of water, binoculars, camera.
